

## Whisky Regions of Scotland

### Highlands Whisky Region

The Highlands is by far the largest of all the whisky producing regions and offers you the greatest variations of style. You will find some of the best known distilleries in this region.

On the mainland in the Western Highlands there are only a few distilleries. The malts from these West Highland distilleries are much less peaty than the malts which are found in the Islay region, although you can detect a slight whiff of smokiness. If there was a common character shared by West Highland whiskies it is they tend to have a sweet start and dryish finish.

The character of the far North Highland malts are greatly influenced by the local soil and the coastal location of the distilleries. They tend to be light bodied whiskies with a spicy character and a dryish finish, sometimes with a trace of saltiness.

Malt whiskies from the Central, Southern and Eastern Highlands are quite a mixed bunch. They are generally fruity and sweet but not as sweet as the malts found in Speyside. They are lighter bodied and sweet and just like other Highland malts they tend to have a dry finish.

### Speyside Whisky Region

Speyside is not officially a whisky region but it is generally accepted as a subdivision of the Highlands Region. Over half of all Scotland's distilleries are located in Speyside. Speyside malts are typically the sweetest of all Scotch Whisky Malts and many of the most popular single malts are produced in Speyside.

The huge selection of Speyside malts offer a variety of strengths and can generally be broken down into two categories, the heavy, rich sherry flavoured malts and the more complex light floral flavoured malts. Speyside malts are essentially sweet whiskies, although some can have a little peaty character with just a slight whiff of smoke.

The list of malts produced in this region of Scotland is pretty overwhelming, but some of the better known names include Glenfiddich, The MacAllan, Balvenie, Glenlivet, Glenfarclas, Glen Moray and Aberlour.

### Islands Whisky Region

Like Speyside the Islands are not officially a whisky region, the Islands is another subdivision of the Highlands Region. The Islands are a geographical region rather than a characteristic one. The Islands region includes all of the whisky producing Isles of Scotland namely Mull, Skye, Orkney, Arran, Jura and Lewis. The Isle of Islay is considered a region on its own.

Due to the location of the Islands distilleries their whiskies tend to have a coastal feel to them. They are slightly peatier in character than most highland malts but not to the extent of peatiness that you will find in Islay malts. The peatiness is generally softer and sweeter than there stronger cousins from Islay.



## Islay Whisky Region

There are eight distilleries on the island of Islay (pronounced Eye-luh). Islay is located in the Inner Hebrides of Scotland. The island is often lashed by sea winds and rain, these elements certainly have a say in the whisky produced there. Islay's surface is very flat and consists largely of peat, which has a huge influence on the flavour of the whiskies produced here.

Islay whiskies are the strongest flavoured of all Scotch whiskies and tend to be dry and peaty. They are renowned for their strong peaty smokiness which comes from the peat fuel which they use for malting the barley.

The character of Islay malt whiskies are very often described as being very smoky and medicinal, salty and sea weedy with a dry finish and sometimes with quite a bite.

The smoky flavour of Islay malts can be an acquired taste, but if you have a taste for a smoky dry malt then Islay malts are the malts for you.

## Lowlands Whisky Region

The Lowland region lies South of an imaginary line that runs from Greenock on the West coast of Scotland to Dundee in the East. Most of the Lowland malts produced in this region end up in blends, but there are still a few single malts available to try from this region.

Malts from this region are light in colour and have quite a dry finish. The dryness comes from the malt itself, not from peat as Lowland malts tend to be produced with unpeated malt. You may also find a certain sweet fruitiness to the flavour. Lowland malts are regarded as an excellent aperitif.

Generally speaking, Lowland region whiskies are mellower than whiskies from the neighbouring Highlands, and are very much appreciated by those new to malt Whisky and experienced malt drinkers alike.

## Campbeltown Whisky Region

Campbeltown lies towards the end of the Mull of Kintyre peninsula on the West Coast of Scotland. Today there are only three distilleries producing whisky here, but in days gone by there were over 30 distilleries here.

The Campbeltown single malts are very distinctive, tending to be full bodied, renowned for their depth of flavour and also for their slightly salty finish. With peat adding a hint of flavour similar to that found in an Islay malt.



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## Campbeltown

### Glen Gyle

- ❖ **Kilkerran 12** - Initially fruity with citrus notes and orange peel, after this: vanilla, butterscotch, honeycomb and digestive biscuits.
- ❖ **Kilkerran Heavily Peated** - Orchard fruits with a citrus hint developing. Green olive, biscuit dough and cinnamon sweeties.

### Glen Scotia

- ❖ **Glen Scotia 15** - Citrus peels, ginger snap biscuits. Apricot aromas develop then drift towards fruit salad.
- ❖ **Glen Scotia 18** - Lemon curd and marmalade. Gingerbread, Manuka honey, peach nectar and caramel.
- ❖ **Glen Scotia 1992** - Dried herbs, tannic oak and cereal sweetness.
- ❖ **Glen Scotia 2006 57.9%** - Heavy vanilla notes take the lead, followed by red berries and cinnamon.
- ❖ **Glen Scotia Double Cask** - Powerful, oily with a touch herbs.
- ❖ **Glen Scotia Ruby Port** - Sea spray, some rich redcurrants and brambles. Sweet with some salty aspects, a lingering spicy smoke.
- ❖ **Glen Scotia Rum Cask** - Finished in Guyana rum casks for eight months bringing a melted brown sugar character which balances wonderfully with the smoky peat and citrus fruits.
- ❖ **Glen Scotia Victoriana** - Crème brûlée notes leading to generous caramelised fruits and finally polished oak.

### Springbank

- ❖ **Hazelburn 10** - A lovely and rich whisky with vanilla and honey flavours, liquorice follows with a refreshing zestiness.
- ❖ **Longrow 10 100%** - Marmalade, orange peel, hints of cut flowers and a vague iodine note.
- ❖ **Longrow 14 Peated Sherry Cask** - Seville orange marmalade, salted rye crackers, praline, earthy smoke.
- ❖ **Longrow Peated** - Rich and creamy with a slight medicinal hint.
- ❖ **Springbank 10** - Malt, oak, spice, nutmeg and cinnamon, vanilla essence.
- ❖ **Springbank 12 Cask Strength** - Salted caramel shortbread, tomato stem, mince pie and cedar.
- ❖ **Springbank 15** - Creamy, raisins, dark chocolate, figs, marzipan, Brazil nuts and vanilla.

## Highlands

### Aberfeldy

- ❖ **Aberfeldy 1991** - Fresh and fruity with a touch of sherry and vanilla. Spice with ripe banana and chocolate.
- ❖ **Aberfeldy 2003** - Baked apple, apricot, cinnamon, and a touch of chocolate. Softly oaked and sweet with golden syrup.
- ❖ **Aberfeldy 12** - Sherried fruit with a trailing hint of smoke. Sweet, malty, a gentle peat but nonetheless the mouth feel is very clean.

### anCnoc

- ❖ **anCnoc 12** - A hint of honey and lemon. Sweet to start with an appetising fruitiness and a long smooth finish.
- ❖ **anCnoc Peat Heart** - Chocolate malt, a touch of BBQ meat, cinder toffee and cardamom seed.
- ❖ **anCnoc Rascan** - Honey and orange, earthy peat smoke, sweet vanilla. A touch of old leather, too.

### Ardmore

- ❖ **Ardmore Legacy** - Smoky notes, joined by drying oak, pear drops and subtle grassy touches.
- ❖ **Ardmore 1998** - Honey-nut cornflakes, dried fruits, and a pinch of cinnamon.

### Ardnamurchan

- ❖ **Ardnamurchan Spirit Batch No.5** - Fruit cake and cinder toffee, with a touch of burnt oak.

### As We Get It

- ❖ **As We Get It Highland 66.1%** - Honeyed dried fruit, nutmeg, black cherry and touches of mocha.

### Balblair

- ❖ **Balblair 12** - Honey and stewed apples on the palate, with a lemon, black liquorice, and vanilla finish.
- ❖ **Balblair 21** - Sweet and creamy on the palate with ripe banana, raspberry and marzipan flavours complemented by hints of heather and honey.
- ❖ **Balblair 1990** - Sweet and spicy in character with hints of honey, raisins and zesty fruits.
- ❖ **Balblair 1991** - Crunchy brown sugar, honeycomb ice-cream, walnut loaf and apple turnover.
- ❖ **Balblair Croze Hermitage Wood Finish 1991** – A touch of cracked pepper followed by summer fruits and citrus flavours.
- ❖ **Balblair 2005** - Citrus blossom (and citrus peels) mixed with hints of barrel char spice and treacle tarts.

## Ben Nevis

- ❖ **Ben Nevis 25** - Rich sherry notes with dried fruit and chocolate.
- ❖ **Ben Nevis McDonald's Peated** - Nose of fruit and gentle peat smoke. Dark chocolate and dried fruits, with a hint of orange zest.

## Blair Athol

- ❖ **Blair Athol 12** - Nutty with sherried notes. Gentle peat. Crisp. Good body, malty and sweet. Citrus and the peels thereof.

## Clynelish

- ❖ **Clynelish 14** - Quite light, great clarity. Orange, soft acidity. Dry oak. Mixed fruits, vanilla, leather.
- ❖ **Clynelish 1997 Cask Strength** - Sichuan pepper spice with dark chocolate and roasted hazelnuts.

## Dalmore

- ❖ **Dalmore 12** - Notes of Seville marmalade and triple sec with winter spices and fruitcake. Zesty cocoa and milk chocolate.
- ❖ **Dalmore 15** - Zesty orange, Curaçao, chocolate. Winter spice, stem ginger in syrup. Hints of anise and a little hickory.
- ❖ **Dalmore Cigar Malt Reserve** - Toffee, caramel edging towards the burnt cinder-toffee side of things.

## Dalwhinnie

- ❖ **Dalwhinnie 15** - Malty. Walnuts steeped in Manuka honey with vanilla sponge. Gentle smoke weaves its way through the cereal with a touch of spice.
- ❖ **Dalwhinnie Winters Gold** - Rich with toffee, fresh green apple and honey notes.

## Deanston

- ❖ **Deanston 12** - Light, cereals, zesty orange marmalade. Barley. Soft, nutty, caramel. Touch of salinity. Oak.
- ❖ **Deanston 18 Rebirth** - Oodles of rich honey, luxurious vanilla, sugary shortbread and a touch of fresh ginger.
- ❖ **Deanston Virgin Oak** - Toffee sweets pop up first, followed by a dollop of cream and oak notes.
- ❖ **Deanston 2008 Brandy Cask** - Thyme honey with a pinch of fresh orange blossom, balance by subtle coffee notes.

## Edradour

- ❖ **Edradour 10** - Cloying, seductive murkiness. Rum, barley, toasted almonds. Some may find themselves lost in the mêlée, not quite enough method to the madness.
- ❖ **Edradour 10 Ballechin** - Peat smoke, sweet, vanilla, toffee, ripe fruit, spicy, fruity, caramel, and cinnamon.

## Fettercairn

- ❖ **Fettercairn 12** - Tropical fruit and sticky Jamaican ginger cake add a sweet and spicy depth which a flicker of bitter herbs and vanilla.

## Glencadam

- ❖ **Glencadam 10** - Beautifully balanced with tart fruits, freshly cut hay and vanilla sweetness.
- ❖ **Glencadam 13** - Grassy malt, juicy pear, grapefruit, a touch of rye bread and marmalade. Lingering cinnamon and poached fruit.

## The Glendronach

- ❖ **Glendronach 8 'The Hielan'** - Oak spices, sultanas, apricot, gingerbread, butterscotch, cocoa and almonds.
- ❖ **Glendronach 12 Original** - Rich, cereals. Barley, creamy, hazelnut. Pain au chocolat, marmalade on toast, nutty.
- ❖ **Glendronach 15** - Oily walnut, new leather, blackberry and apple crumble, toasted brown sugar and a touch of liquorice root.
- ❖ **Glendronach 18 Allardice** - Praline, tangerine and a hint smokiness. Dry walnuts, well roasted coffee beans and treacle.
- ❖ **Glendronach 21 Parliament** - Golden Syrup, tangy oak notes, peach, cherry blossom, cocoa and honeydew melon.
- ❖ **Glendronach Peated** - Cinnamon and wood smoke lead to runny honey and dried raisin.
- ❖ **Glendronach Cask Strength Batch 7** - Gingerbread and cinnamon lead to melted chocolate, coffee, and brown sugar.

## Glen Garioch

- ❖ **Glen Garioch 12** - Earthy, stewed fruit. Rich, mouth filling, toasty oak, dried fruit, hint of mocha.
- ❖ **Glen Garioch 1797 Founders Reserve** - Chocolate lime sweets and brandy butter, allspice and cured ham.

## Glenglassaugh

- ❖ **Glenglassaugh Evolution** - White peppery oak, crisp green apple. Salted caramel and ripe banana.
- ❖ **Glenglassaugh Octaves Classic** - Apple and caramel notes developing into massive waves of vanilla.
- ❖ **Glenglassaugh Octaves Peated** - Smoke begins to come to the fore on the palate, though the sherried sweetness balances it well.
- ❖ **Glenglassaugh Revival** - Sweet, rounded and creamy. Oranges, plums, cherry and walnuts and chocolate.
- ❖ **Glenglassaugh Torfa Heavily Peated** - Sweet peat smoke engulfs candied peel over melon, pineapple and roasted red apples.

- ❖ **Glenglassaugh The Spirit Drink That Dare Not Speak its Name** - This is Glenglassaugh's malt spirit after six months of ageing in ex-wine casks. A great little experiment.

### Glengoyne

- ❖ **Glengoyne 10** - Slightly herbal, big bourbon influence. White milk bottle sweets, more creamy than fruity.
- ❖ **Glengoyne 12** - Over-ripe grapes, honeyed with hints of vanilla, coconut milk and oak spice. Light touches of chocolate ice-cream.
- ❖ **Glengoyne 15** - Oily, rich palate entry with notes of toffee popcorn, salted butter and hints of ground walnuts. Allspice and lemon rinds.
- ❖ **Glengoyne 18** - Creamy custard and dried peels. Allspice, Manuka honey and hints of butterscotch.

### Glen Lochy

- ❖ **Glen Lochy 1979** - Initially grapefruit, mango and banana flavours, complemented by a milk chocolate finish.

### Glenmorangie

- ❖ **Glenmorangie Original** - Very fruity and thick. Rich notes of lemon, nectarine and apple.
- ❖ **Glenmorangie 12 Lasanta Sherry Cask** - Plenty rich and creamy with dark chocolate, dried fruit and fresh honey.
- ❖ **Glenmorangie 12 Nectar D'Or** - Fruity, a barley sweetness. Cereal and barley, malty spice and berry fruits.
- ❖ **Glenmorangie 12 Quinta Ruban** - Winter berries and a touch of port. Notes of barely sugar and cereal.
- ❖ **Glenmorangie 18 Extremely Rare** - Creamy honey and Greek yoghurt, grapefruit, exotic spice, berry compote.

### Glenturret

- ❖ **Glenturret Fly's 16 masters** - Fragrant cereal, lemon peel, vanilla and toffee apple, mocha and cinnamon.
- ❖ **Glenturret Sherry Edition** - Sweet and comforting, with touches of honey, vanilla and spice.
- ❖ **Glenturret Triple Wood** - Citrus peels, crushed nuts, fresh pear. American Sherry oak, European Sherry oak and ex-bourbon casks.
- ❖ **Glenturret 2004** - Peppery with zesty orange and chocolate flavours. Followed by a charred oak edge.

## Loch Lomond

- ❖ **Inchmoan 12** - Plenty of black pepper and cinnamon spice, balanced by layers of toffee and fruitier notes.
- ❖ **Inchmoan 1992** - Vanilla and black pepper with medicinal and subtly earthy notes joined by baking spices and cookie dough.
- ❖ **Inchmurrin 18** - Candied lemon and tropical fruit, with a core development of sweet vanilla and gingerbread.
- ❖ **Inchmurrin Madeira Wood Finish** - Rounded nutty toffee, sweet wood spice, hints of pot pourri and citrus.
- ❖ **Loch Lomond Original** - Sweet cereal notes building over time to give an almost creamy texture to the palate. With flavours of brazil nuts.
- ❖ **Loch Lomond 12** - Creamy vanilla with a touch of freshly baked apple turnover. Brown sugar, five spice, and orchard fruits.

## MacDuff

- ❖ **MacDuff 2000** - Green apple, banana, citrus and a hint of oak.
- ❖ **MacDuff 2000 Cask Strength** - Ripe banana, grapefruit and hints of methanol. With a charred oak finish.
- ❖ **The Deveron 12** - A core of butterscotch with waxy malt and apple pie.

## Millburn

- ❖ **Millburn 1978** - Drying with a subtle burst of spice, ground pepper. Some vanilla notes with a charred wood edge.

## Oban

- ❖ **Oban 14** - Peat smoke and a salty maritime flavour with citrus orangey notes and the sweeter honeyed notes.
- ❖ **Oban Distillers Edition** - Fruity and intense. A glorious zesty nose with salt and roasted caramel malt.
- ❖ **Oban Little Bay** - Oily and full-bodied; sweet overall, slightly salty, spicy across the tongue.

## Old Pulteney

- ❖ **Old Pulteney 12** - Chocolate peanuts, mint, citrus peels, maritime elements and white pepper.
- ❖ **Old Pulteney 17** - Sweet with traces of apples and pears: slightly woody with a hint of butterscotch.
- ❖ **Pulteney 1998 Cask Strength** - Fresh initially with hints of ripe summer fruits - raspberries.
- ❖ **Pulteney 2005** - Peppery with grapefruit, dried apricot and mango.

## Royal Brackla

- ❖ **Royal Brackla 12** - Pain au chocolat. Baking spices and gateau.
- ❖ **Royal Brackla 1998** - Warming toasty notes, rich malt and berries.
- ❖ **Royal Brackla 1999** - Fruity vanilla and baked apples. Surprisingly chocolatey, waves of fresh fruit. Waxy citrus peels.

## Royal Lochnagar

- ❖ **Royal Lochnagar 12** - Planed wood, light toffee. Linseed oil behind, and later a lychee-like acidity.
- ❖ **Royal Lochnagar Distillers Edition** - Skilled double maturation in old Muscat cask-wood brings a sweet and floral richness.

## Stronachie

- ❖ **Stronachie 10** - Smooth with luscious honey and biscuits, then lingering pepper and cereal notes.

## Teaninich

- ❖ **Teaninich 10 Flora and Fauna** - Notes of cut hay and chamomile, hints of winter spice and a gentle citric acidity.

## Tomatin

- ❖ **Tomatin 12 Sherry Cask** - A complex bouquet contains rich malt and fruity aromas with a hint of peatiness.
- ❖ **Tomatin 14 Portwood** - A powerful fruity and nutty whisky. Finished in specially selected tawny port pipes.
- ❖ **Tomatin 18** - Sweet and honeyed at first, with an oaky edge. A bite of citrus and a hint of dark chocolate.
- ❖ **Tomatin 1996** - Sweet and spicy with chilli spice, orange and green apple flavours. Complimented by a milk chocolate edge.
- ❖ **Tomatin 1997** - Citrus blossom, chocolate and peppery oak.
- ❖ **Tomatin 2001** - Sweet vanilla and ripe banana with a hint of pear and white chocolate.
- ❖ **Tomatin 2007** - Sweet with peach, banana and a touch of vanilla.
- ❖ **Tomatin Legacy** - Light and delicate with a candy sweetness which is peppered with hints of pine.

## Tomatin - Cu Bocan

- ❖ **Cù Bòcan 2005 Ltd Ed** - A burst of candy floss and birch sap sweetness is complimented by a gentle touch of peat smoke.
- ❖ **Cù Bòcan** - A mesmeric mix of lime, grapefruit and tangerines with rich almond and aniseed.
- ❖ **Cù Bòcan Bourbon Ltd Ed** - Velvety smooth coconut and vanilla. Citrus fruits have a significant presence.

## Tullibardine

- ❖ **Tullibardine 1993** - Malty influences - cereal notes with a defined sweetness, some delicate spice and creamy.
- ❖ **Tullibardine 225 Sauternes cask** - Notes of candied orange and Seville marmalade. A little dried pineapple and white chocolate.
- ❖ **Tullibardine 228 Burgundy cask** - Creamy, nutty palate entry with notes of sweet custard, apple peel, red berries and orange.

## Clachaig Whisky and Scottish Spirits Menu

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- ❖ **Tullibardine 500 Sherry cask** - Cooked fruit, cinnamon and Manuka honey. Dates and hints of allspice.
- ❖ **Tullibardine Sovereign** - White chocolate, allspice and charred oak. With notes of pear cider, allspice and creamy chocolate.
- ❖ **Tullibardine The Murray Marsala Cask** - Coffee and chocolate, paired with raspberry and orange peel. A hint of clove underneath.

### Wolfburn

- ❖ **Wolfburn Northland** - Sweet nutty tones. Hints of grape and honey with coffee and dark chocolate.
- ❖ **Wolfburn Aurora** - Almonds and pecans, with a wave of sweet, sticky Sherry notes.

## Island

- ❖ **Secret Stills Island 1986** - Notes of sherry and wood smoke, a little winter spice and a touch of iodine with graceful sweetness.

## Isle of Arran

### Arran

- ❖ **Arran 10** - A touch of cinnamon adds a spicy edge to the soft and sweet texture which captivates the palate.
- ❖ **Arran 21** - Orange chocolate, damson jam, mango, hay, subtle charred cedar notes developing.
- ❖ **Arran Amarone Cask Finish** - Notes of dark plum wrestle with bitter-sweet apricots and a hint of cinnamon.
- ❖ **Arran Côte-Rôtie** - Bucketful's of dark chocolate balanced by a dash of citrus, with lots of dried fruit alongside fresh fig and plum, with a hint of charred oak.
- ❖ **Arran Loch Ranza** - Beautifully balanced citrus fruit and light vanilla sweetness with a burst of apple and delicate marine notes.
- ❖ **Arran Marsala** - Very dry spice from cloves and nutmeg fizzes through chocolate-y hazelnut, bitter orange and grapefruit and a touch of toasted oak.
- ❖ **Arran Port Cask Finish** - Layered fruits and spice combine, with cinnamon baked apple wrestling with raisin and plum pudding.
- ❖ **Arran 2009** - Sweet and creamy with banana, lime, and toasted cereal flavours.
- ❖ **Arran 1996** - Sweet and creamy, with notes of vanilla and rhubarb.

## Isle of Islay

### Ardbeg

- ❖ **Ardbeg 10** - Sweet vanilla counterbalanced with lemon and lime followed by that surging Ardbeg smoke that we all know and love.
- ❖ **Ardbeg An Oa** - Notes of cigars and golden syrup flapjacks with sweet black tea on the tail and hints of chocolate limes.
- ❖ **Ardbeg Corryvreckan** - Cream, spices, tingling, fresh fruit, medicinal, plasters, Clementine's. Orange peels.
- ❖ **Ardbeg Grooves** - Vanilla fudge, toffee popcorn and tarred fruits. Seaside bonfire and smoked salts with a mellow sweetness.
- ❖ **Ardbeg Uigeadail** - Ripe fruit and black forest honey. The throne then usurped by powerful peat and smoked barley.

### As We Get It

- ❖ **As We Get It Islay** - Big and rich. Spices, supple peat, good sweetness.

### Bowmore

- ❖ **Bowmore 10 Dark & Intense** - Flamed orange peel, sea salt, Cadbury Bournville.
- ❖ **Bowmore 12** - Vanilla, perfumed smoke and coastal elements develop. Dark Peat. Blossom, oily sweetness.
- ❖ **Bowmore 15 Darkest** - Rich, woody, pine oil. Syrupy. Lovely, creamy toffee and malt. Smoky.
- ❖ **Bowmore 15 Old Gold & Elegant** - A touch of smoked kipper as it opens, leading to seaside fudge and honeyed barley.
- ❖ **Bowmore 18** - Light fragrant smoke with butterscotch, nectarines, light menthol, brine and ferns.
- ❖ **Bowmore Devils Cask III** - Corinth raisins, salted caramel, melted chocolate, sticky prunes and flamed orange peel.
- ❖ **Bowmore Vaults Edition** - Sun-ripened fruits, zingy spiced cocoa and blood orange.

### Bruichladdich

- ❖ **Bruichladdich Classic Laddie Scottish Barley** - Red apples and white grapes, with touches of sweet cinnamon and brown sugar.
- ❖ **Bruichladdich Port Charlotte 6 Islay Barley** - Dry smoke, salted caramel and apple sauce.
- ❖ **Bruichladdich Port Charlotte 10** - Lots of sweet berry on the nose. Vanilla-rich smoke, with lasting notes of coffee and treacle.
- ❖ **Bruichladdich 1994 56.2%** - Peppery with sweet bursts of apple, banana, and hints of blueberry.

- ❖ **Wildcat Gin** - Juniper with a light citrus note, a hint of white pepper and spice.

### Wild Island

- ❖ **Colonsay Wild Island** - Citrus-forward, with hints of fresh mint and tea.

### Wild Thyme Spirits

- ❖ **Colonsay Gin** - Bright, oily juniper up front with early notes in tow. A touch of citrus sweetness develops underneath.
- ❖ **Colonsay Bramble Gin Liqueur** - Infused with Scottish brambles.

- ❖ **Arbikie Strawberry Vodka** - Butterscotch hints from our estate grown wheat add to that a glorious strawberry jam aroma.

- ❖ **Botanical Vodka** - An undoubtedly smooth vodka with a surprising yet satisfying earthy under note.

- ❖ **Spiced Rum** - Currant buns, cassia, peppercorn, caramelised dates, a kick of Curaçao orange, fizzy cola bottle sweeties.

- ❖ **Dunedin Gold Rum** - A bold fruity nose with notes of dark chocolate. A complex blend of sweet vanilla and spicy flavours gives way to burnt sugar and caramel with an oaky finish.

- ❖ **White Rum** - Bursting with tropical fruit – pineapple, mango, banana and peach. An earthy quality comes through, too.

### Wester

- ❖ **Spiced Rum** - A rich, full bodied flavour, the rum is infused with the finest spices, citrus zests and vanilla.

- ❖ **UWA Reposado** - A sweet honey and vanilla taste with an earthiness from the lowland agave. A balance of sweet caramel notes and a subtle oaky finish from the whisky cask.
- ❖ **UWA Platinum Blanco** - Gently flavoured by the Mango, Orange and Lemon trees that surround the estate, with hints of sweetness and strong cooked Agave notes throughout.
